#### **OUR ENVIRONMENT**



So many people are outdoors enjoying the Sligo Creek watershed and watching nature rebound as spring takes hold. Owl and hawk sightings, the return of the Yellow Crested Night

Heron, the call of the frogs, those iridescent noisy ducks, the wonderous transformation from dead sticks to live willow stakes on the terraced banks of the Bennington Tributary – just to name a few delights. How do we become stewards of the watershed?

- o To protect our owls, hawks, fox, other wildlife, pets and even our children, please don't use ANY type of rat poisoning. Owls and other creatures eat poisoned mice and die themselves or become sick. To learn more about managing rodents, see <a href="http://www.birc.org/RaptorQ.pdf">http://www.birc.org/RaptorQ.pdf</a>.
- o To protect Sligo Creek, join Friends of Sligo Creek in opposing the installation of plastic carpet on Ellsworth in Downtown Silver Spring. Runoff from this spot drains into Sligo Creek. Kids and dogs play around the creek. It's the watering hole for local nature we cherish. It becomes our drinking water. #### **LEASH LAWS**



Any dog is at large if it is outside the owner's premises and not leashed, unless it is a service dog, is in a dog exercise area designated by the

Maryland National Capital Park and Planning Commission, or is participating in an approved activity.

Any other animal (i.e., cat or livestock animal) is at large if it is outside the owner's premises and not leashed or immediately responsive to verbal or nonverbal direction.

(\$100 fine for first offense; \$500 fine for each subsequent violation)
